FOR more than a decade, Rhondda Walters studied and tutored with the influential teacher Desiderius Orban (1884-1986) and her work continues to reflect the influence of those years.

In these latest paintings at Lindsay St, she builds surfaces in light and shadow - with textured paint and collage.

It is a curious world but not an abstract one. There are lumpy edifices, caves, and meaningful passageways among which figures occasionally appear.

Recurrent surges towards an ever-brighter light, and backlighting that imitates stained glass windows, suggest that Walters' motivation is almost certainly spiritual.
