## Three new exhibitions at Muswellbrook arts centre

THE current exhibition at the Muswellbrook Regional Arts Centre will be seen for the last time on Sunday and preparations are already underway for the next showcase.

Mrs Walters' collection entitled 'Journey' is based on different moments and travels over the last 30 years to create a large range of variations utilising texture, different media, and colour combinations on a myriad of surfaces.
